

## Website Cookies Policy

This document explains how Adams & Remers LLP (The “Firm”) uses cookies and how we may collect and process information about you through our website, [www.adamsandremers.com](http://www.adamsandremers.com) (the “Website”). Cookies are small text files that are placed on your computer (on internet enabled device) by websites that you visit. Such websites are able to read and write these files allowing them to store things such as personalisation details or user preferences.

Cookies provide a ‘memory’ for websites, enabling them to recognise a user and respond appropriately. The Firm uses cookies to collect information about your use of the Website and to distinguish you from other users in order to customise and thereby improve your browsing experience of the Website. Cookies are deleted after 36 months. Information on the cookies this Website uses is given below. Clicking the ‘Continue’ button enables cookies and removes the warning message. (The warning message will only be shown five times).

If you do not want to accept cookies from the Website, you will need to set your browser setting to block cookies. You can read how to do so [here](#). However, you should be aware that disabling cookies on your browser may affect your experience of the Website. Each web domain can only access cookies stored by that specific web domain, meaning that only the Firm’s servers can access the cookies set by the Website.

We only use one type of cookie on this site, which is Google Analytics. We use this to understand how the Website is being used in order to improve the user experience. User data is all anonymous.
